

When Father William asked me to write a column that was short and stress-free, I thought: it can be one or the other, not both. Short and pithy is the most difficult way to write because every word has to count. There's a quote often misattributed to Mark Twain. Though he never actually wrote this to a friend, the sentiment remains true: "Please forgive this long letter. I didn't have time to write a short one."

Done well, short is good. The Bible is full of one-liners that endure because they're wise and easy to remember. "Let there be light." "Am I my brother's keeper?" The Golden Rule boils down to three words: "Do unto others." The second half of that phrase—"as you would have them do unto you"—is usually left unsaid. "Do unto others," perhaps the best single piece of life advice, is short enough to fit on a bumper sticker, T-shirt or fortune cookie slip.

Advertisers do this well. When she was eight years old, I overheard my daughter singing to herself the TV jingle for Empire Carpet: "Five-eight-eight, two-three-hundred, Empire." I don't know my own kids' phone numbers by heart but I can order carpet from memory. Our kids now sing along to ads for GLP-1s ("Oh-oh-oh Ozempic") or dairy products ("Only Daisy Cottage Cheese will do..."). The other night we heard "1-877-Kars-for-Kids" and now, just by reading this, you are also hearing it play in your head. Sorry about that.

But such is the power of short, memorable writing. The Biblical phrases that have stuck in my head over the years include "Do not be afraid," "The meek shall inherit the earth" and "The last shall be first, and the first last." Among the countless pop lyrics I can instantly summon, there is also a line from a school Mass hymn: "Whatsoever you do to the least of my brothers, that you do unto me." It's short and unforgettable. It could be an advertising tagline but it also happens to be a precept for life.





The current recommendations for colonoscopy are for individuals at average risk to start colon cancer screening at age 45. Those at higher risk, such as a family history of colorectal cancer or a history of polyps or inflammatory bowel disease may need to begin screening earlier and/or have more frequent exams.

A colonoscopy typically takes about 20 to 30 minutes and is performed by a gastroenterologist. There are several steps to the process as follows:

Preparation – Proper bowel preparation is essential for a successful colonoscopy. Patients are usually instructed to follow a clear liquid diet for 24-48 hours before the procedure and take a prescribed laxative to empty the colon. This ensures that the colon is "cleaned out" and the doctor has a clear view of the colon lining.

Sedation – Most patients receive (heavy!) sedation to help them take a nap (sleep!) and remain comfortable throughout the procedure. This type of sedation is administered by a trained anesthesia provider.

Examination – During the colonoscopy, a thin, flexible tube with a tiny camera at the end (colonoscope) is inserted into the rectum and gently guided through the colon. The camera transmits images to a screen, allowing the doctor to examine the colon lining and identify any abnormalities. If polyps or suspicious growths are found, they can be removed or biopsied for further analysis.

Recovery – After the procedure, you'll rest until the anesthesia wears off. Since sedation is used it is necessary to have someone drive you home and preferably remain with you throughout the day.

Colonoscopy is a safe and effective [and potentially lifesaving!] procedure that allows for early detection and prompt treatment of colon cancer and other gastrointestinal issues. It's important to be proactive about maintaining colon health and preventing serious GI diseases by undergoing a colonoscopy screening as recommended.




Faith Formation (Religious Education)

Holy Hiking


In October we hiked at Dismal Brook Preserve. We had the perfect day, a great time, and once again, our younger hikers did a phenomenal job!






